

Happy are those who take refuge in God!



SCRIPTURE READING


I Corinthians 12:12-23

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and those members of the body that we think less honorable we clothe with greater honor, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect;

This is the word of God for the people of God.

Thanks be to God.





And it's more than just our unconscious moments of embedded ableism – we're still regularly tempted to consciously ignore at best – and disown at worst – the very bodies that contain and sustain us. 

From Cheesehead to Hoosier to Angeleno - Louis Spear Sunday, May 5th (11am) Wesley Room and via Zoom


