### Westwood UMC Mission Statement






# THE LOFT - "Jesus & His Neighbors" - Rev. Stephanie Rice Today, March 23rd (10:30am) The Loft

From the outset of his public ministry, Jesus includes disciples within his inner circle whom his Jewish contemporaries believed did not deserve a seat at the table. When questioned by a lawyer about one person's moral obligations to another, Jesus begins and ends a parable with the question, "Who is my neighbor?" In our increasingly polarized political and theological climate, many of our physical neighbors are strangers to us, and some whom we work beside or even love can feel like strangers. Given this, perhaps the important questions for us to ask ourselves are not only who our neighbors are but also whether we are acting as good neighbors ought to. Rev. Stephanie Rice, Associate Pastor at Glendale First United Methodist Church will lead this Sunday while Rev. Dr. Carter is on vacation.


