





"Celie & Esther: The Courage to Speak" - Rev. Dr. Christopher Carter Today, May 4th (10:30am) The Loft

During May, The Loft will celebrate the ways that art, especially musical theater, can help lead us to the salvation we find in ourselves, our community, and God. The four musicals that will shape our gatherings this month are The Color Purple, Into The Woods, Les Misérables, and Rent. Each week, we will explore how themes from biblical stories and that week's play can deepen our faith. This week - Celie is a young black woman growing up in rural Georgia in the early 20th century. Esther is a young queen and Jewish woman living under Persian colonialism around 450 BCE. Though they lived over two thousand years apart, their stories have unfortunate similarities that have stood the test of time. Patriarchy and sexism are not new, and yet what we see in their stories is that if you are faithful in an unfaithful world, you will find the voice that God has placed within you.



WISDOM AT WESTWOOD: 2 BEASTS, 7 SEALS, & 1 SLAIN LAMB THE BOOK OF REVELATION with Rev. Dr. John Holbert Today, May 4th (11am) Wesley Room and via Zoom

The Book of Revelation has been consistently and erroneously used as a New Testament writing to terrify the reader and to affirm the few faithful who will "escape the tribulation." This characterization is wrong on both counts. John wrote his imaginative narrative both to denounce imperial Rome and to announce the universal mercy of God, employing both harsh and compassionate language. His book, as strange as it may at first sound, holds valuable insights for his own time and for ours.
